Italicize "The Bible" and follow it with the version you are using.

The Bible. Authorized King James Version, Oxford UP, 1998.

The Bible. The New Oxford Annotated Version, 3rd ed., Oxford UP, 2001.

The New Jerusalem Bible. Edited by Susan Jones, Doubleday, 1985.

IN-TEXT (PARENTHETICAL)

In the first parenthetical citation that appears in your essay, make clear which Bible translation you're using (and underline or italicize the title), followed by the name of the book (do not italicize or underline), chapter and verse. For example:

Ezekiel saw "what seemed to be four living creatures," each with faces of a man, a lion, an ox, and an eagle (*New Jerusalem Bible*, Ezek. 1:5-10).

If future references employ the same edition of the Bible you're using, list only the book, chapter, and verse in the parenthetical citation. (Ezek. 1:5-10).
